SPRING WEIGHT LIMITS IN EFFECT SOON

It's March and the spring thaw is underway. This means that seasonal weight limits will be going into effect on Berry roads. The start date of these weight limits is determined each year by weather conditions. The posting of weight limits signs is your notice that the weight limits have been reduced to 12,000 pounds maximum weight per axle. This covers all vehicles, including farm equipment and manure wagons.

Berry instituted seasonal weight limits last year in order to reduce the wear and tear on Town roads during the spring thaw, when the roads are most vulnerable. Last year, while the Town was still educating residents, farmers and truckers, we did not undertake enforcement activities. Enforcement is anticipated this year.

If you don't know the weight of your manure-hauling trailer, it is important that you take it to a scale and get it weighed, or contact the manufacturer for the net vehicle weight. Liquid manure weighs 8.5 to 9.5 pounds per gallon. This means you may only be able to fill the unit half full during the spring weight limits.

If you have a special reason to move vehicles over the 12,000 pounds maximum axle load, you may be eligible for a permit. Contact Highway Commissioner Anthony Varda (798-9999) to determine eligibility. Berry Ordinance 300.7, establishing the seasonal weight limits, is available at the Town website.

BERRY TO SEEK PSC INVESTIGATION OF INTERNET SERVICE

Since the Town's 2008 high-speed internet survey, TDS has improved access in parts of the Town of Berry, primarily along the Highway 19 corridor. Still, a number of residents in Berry do not have access to high-speed internet. The Town Board has authorized a petition before the Public Service Commission (PSC) for an investigation of TDS's inadequate service.

PSC rules require a certain level of service, which we believe TDS is not presently providing. If the investigation confirms our belief, TDS may well be ordered to provide high-speed internet service to the remaining Berry residents who cannot obtain it. If you want high-speed internet service, this is your opportunity to make a difference.

If you cannot obtain high-speed internet service on your telephone line, and wish to join in the petition to the PSC, please email or telephone Town Clerk Brenda Kahl at twnberry@chorus.net; 767-4152. There is no financial obligation if you become involved, but you will need to be available to answer questions from PSC investigators about your internet service.

HISTORIC HOMES SOLD AND FOR SALE

The historic Kohlmann House, adjacent to Indian Lake, has been sold by Dane County. The new owners are Jon and Meredith Beckman of Madison. Because it is on the Historic Register, the Kohlmann House came with restrictions, administered by the Wisconsin State Historical Society, that minimize changes on the exterior of the house. The Beckmans hope to go to work this spring restoring the stone shell of the building, repairing the roof, and replacing windows. They have a multi-year plan for restoration and plan to become residents of the Town of Berry, as soon as the house becomes habitable. The fieldstone house, built in 1867, is listed on the National Register of Historic Places. The original owner, Frederick Kohlmann, came to the area in 1848.

Meanwhile, down Highway 19, the stone house to the west of Marxville, known as the Schuman or Matz House, has been listed for sale. The Schuman House is another of Berry's historic stone residences. The house has been unoccupied for years and would require extensive work to become habitable. However, the Schuman House also comes with a barn, shed, granary and garage. It would make an excellent B&B or a unique residence for someone with a lot of things to keep in storage. HIGHWAY 14

–A LONG AND WINDING STUDY

The Wisconsin Department of Transportation study of Highway 14 is complete. It was presented to agency and local officials on March 3rd at the Cross Plains-Berry fire department. **The presentation for public input will be held on March 9th starting at 6pm at the Wisconsin Heights High School** just west of Black Earth on Highway 14.

The study documents, in depth, the environmental, social and traffic patterns that currently exist. It also lays out what can be done to limit access to and exits from the highway to keep safety in the forefront. Various options for changes to the roadway are exhibited. The changes in Berry are many and should be of interest to all residents.

This is not a study for a bypass, for added lanes (other than a turning lane here and there), or any trail lanes next to the roadway. It is however, a very worthwhile presentation of what could evolve in our communities over the next 20 years. This is your chance to have some input. Please plan to attend.

GOOD NEIGHBORS PREVIEWS HIGHWAY 14 STUDY AT ITS FEBURARY MEETING

Nine days after the newly unveiled Cross Plains official map (containing a route for a village bypass, a commercial zone on CTY P in Berry, and a new layout of a HWY 14 and CTY P intersection) was soundly rejected by area residence and officials from neighboring communities, Wis DOT presented their study for the Highway 14 corridor between Middleton west to Mazomanie to the Good Neighbors Committee.

The study focuses on ways to ensure Highway 14 remains safe and efficient within the near future within the existing corridor. The elimination of curves, as well as placement, number and spacing of intersections seems to be the main concern. Shown were intersections that now meet only minimum vision criteria.

Attendees deemed the hour and a half well spent and began contemplating implications for Town road budgets and plans for the future.
